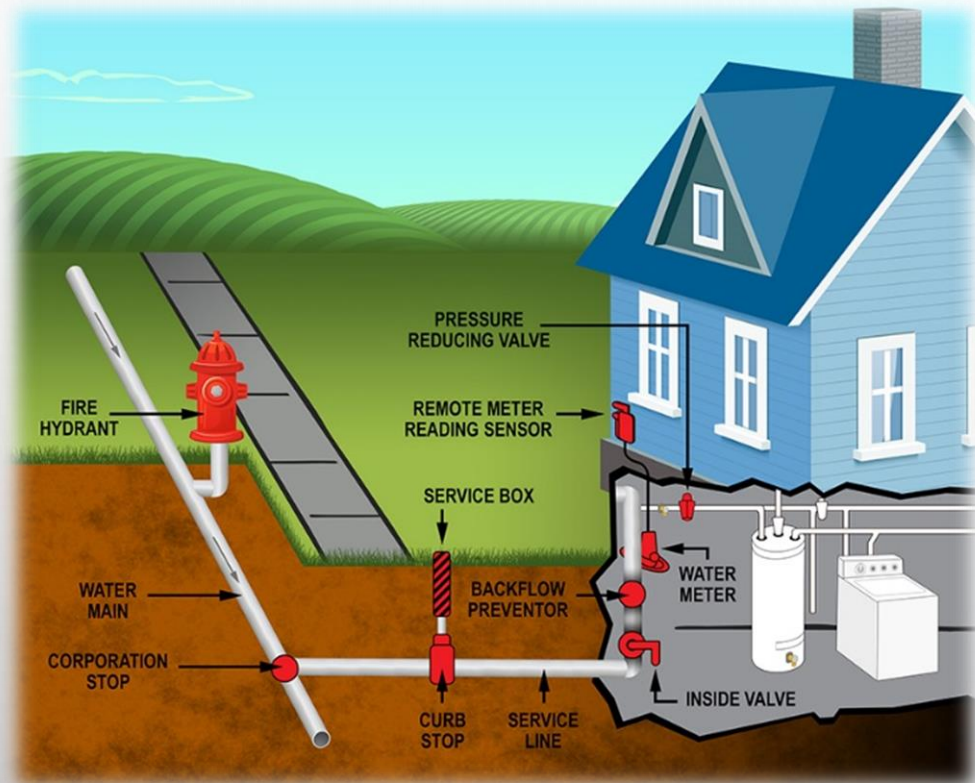


STREET TO SINK: WHO'S RESPONSIBLE FOR WHAT?

Hooksett Village Water Precinct is responsible for producing, treating, storing and distributing drinking water to thousands of residents, businesses and institutions in accordance with NHDES and USEPA regulations. The Precinct makes significant investments in operations, maintenance and capital projects to make sure the water system delivers a reliable quantity and quality of water to you.

As a Precinct customer, you are responsible for maintaining all water system equipment and plumbing on your property. You must comply with applicable Precinct regulations and local plumbing codes.

PRECINCT RESPONSIBILITY: In public streets and rights-of-way, the Precinct owns and maintains all water system equipment including mains, tanks, hydrants, valves and service line connections between the main and curb stops (street shutoffs), except that the Customer installs new connections and removes abandoned connections.

CUSTOMER RESPONSIBILITY: On private property, the Customer owns/maintains all water system equipment including:

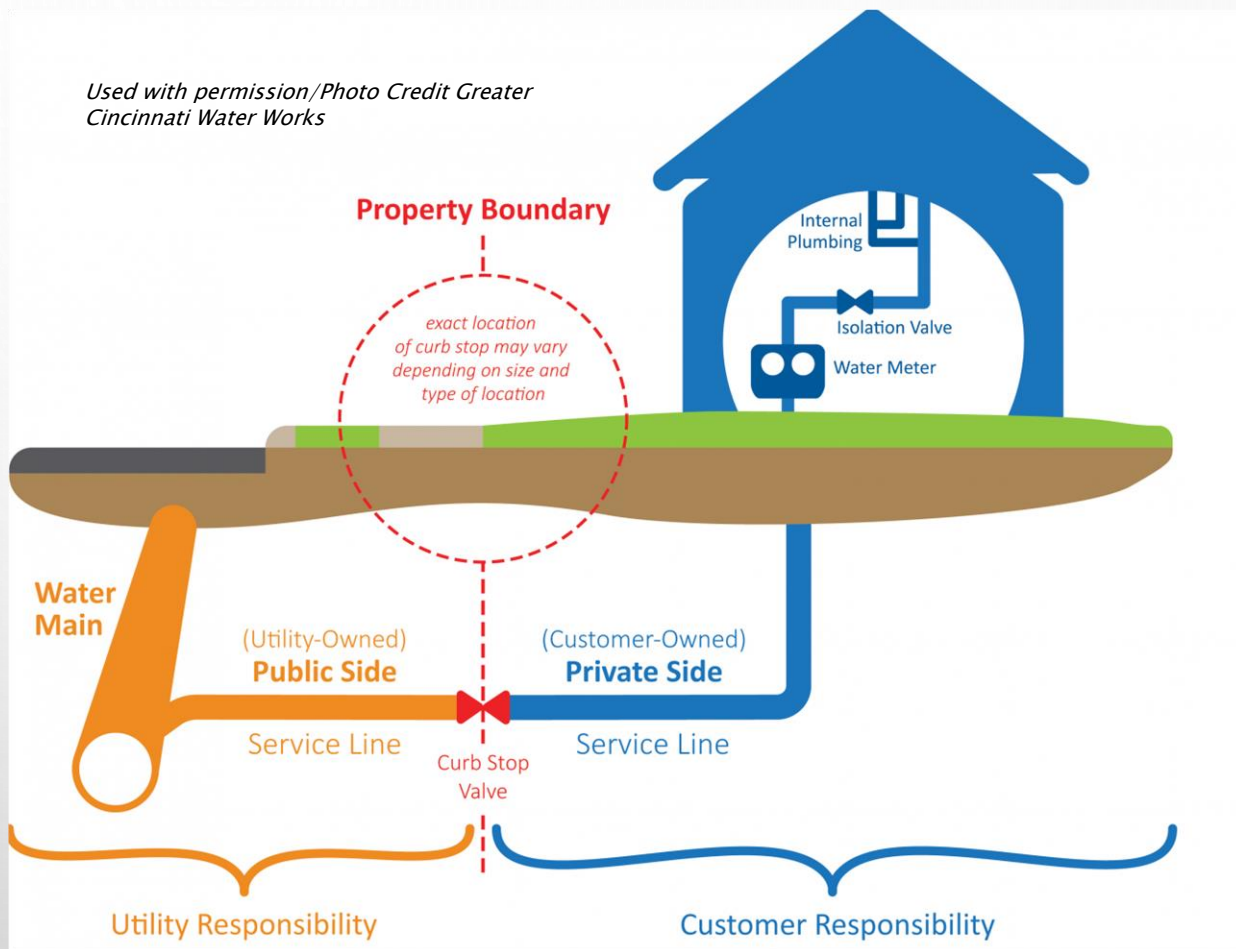
- Service line (curb stop to building)
- Interior plumbing (shutoff valves; pressure reducing valves; kitchen, bath, space heating and fire suppression equipment; etc.)
- Lawn irrigation equipment
- Backflow prevention devices

Backflow preventers are **REQUIRED** if a potential threat to water quality exists, including all in-ground irrigation and commercial fire sprinkler systems.

The Customer is responsible for the costs and maintenance of water meters, except that the Precinct pays for domestic meters less than 1" in size and requires periodic meter replacement.

Commercial sites and residential facilities are also responsible for mains, hydrants and valves on their properties.
